Los Gatos Loses a Man of Peace: Dr. Rudolph Orson Waiton (1922-2008)



Dr. Rudolph Orson Waiton, 86, Los Gatos physician and surgeon, passed away peacefully after a long illness on Monday, Sept. 1, 2008.

Dr. Waiton, born on June 11, 1922 in Monessen, PA, received a B.S. from the University of Pittsburgh, an M.A. from Stanford University, and then began his career as a teacher. Following his childhood dream, he returned to school and received a Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine from Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine and later an M.D. from the University of Oregon. Always learning, he completed the following fellowships: Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine, Homeopathic and Holistic medicine. He received Board Certifications from the American Osteopathic Board of Rehabilitation Medicine, American Osteopathic Board of Family Practice, American Academy of Pain Management and Integrative Medicine. He earned status as a Qualified Medical Evaluator. Dr. Waiton served in the U.S. Air Force, Chennault's Flying Tigers, and completed 99 combat missions during World War II and 38 combat missions during the Korean War. Although Dr. Waiton attained the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and received the Distinguished Flying Cross, he considered his most notable societal contribution to be as an ambassador for peace.

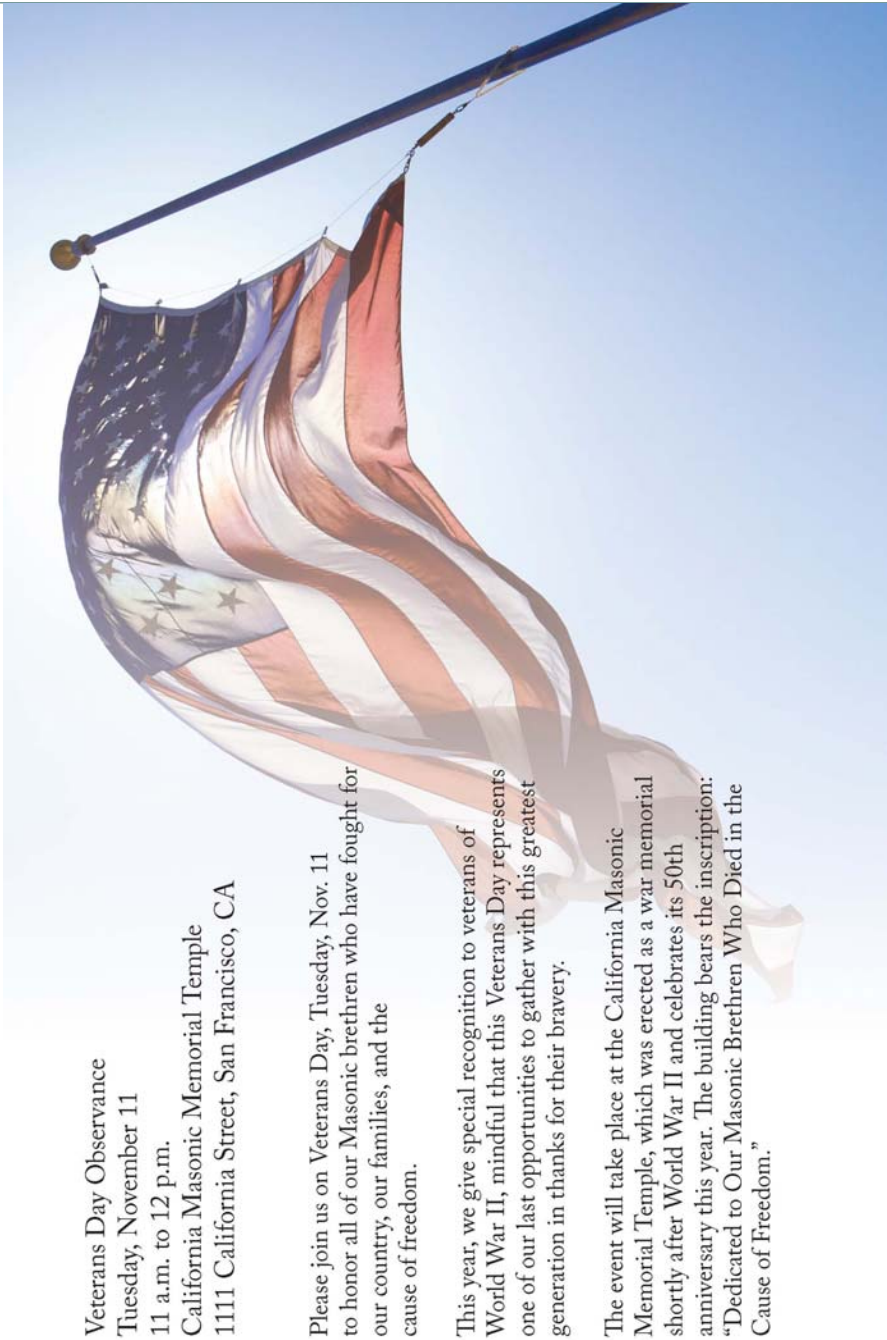

Waiton and his wife, Marilyn, traveled to 28 countries to speak out against global conflict and raise public awareness regarding the catastrophic consequences of nuclear warfare. He considered it his honor and privilege to speak on behalf of the children, who have no vote, and to protect the planet. Dr. Waiton was humbled when he was honored as a noted participant in the 1985 Nobel Peace Prize awarded to the International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War. Throughout his life, Dr. Waiton received a number of awards for his dedication to osteopathic medicine. He was a Charter Fellow of the International College of General Practice, a Diplomate of the American Board of

Homeopathic Medicine, and a Fellow of the American Academy and International College of Applied Nutrition. Retaining his California teaching credential, Dr. Waiton was an Adjunct Professor at the College of the Pacific and San Francisco College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Waiton was a dedicated medical practitioner who was devoted to his patients, in private practice at 221 Almendra Ave. for over thirty years.

Dr. Waiton was proud to be an Elk and a 32nd-degree Scottish Rite Freemason.
